For challenging herself in her English writing this week - well done!

Dear All

This week, the children took part in their first P.E lesson with Miss Steer from Spires. This term, the children we will be taking advantage of the lovely weather for the first few weeks with the children learning some athletics. Following on from this, they will be learning invasion games developing their hand eye coordination and team skills.

In maths, we have begun our learning of number and place value. In class, we have been exploring how we can represent numbers using a range of concrete materials. We have used place value counters, diennes and place value grids to represent our number accurately. This has enabled the children to fully understand numbers.

In English, we have been exploring how authors describe characters. Using a character grid, we explored how Roald Dahl had described Mrs Pratchett and Miss Trunchbull and the impression he has created on the reader. Following on from this, some of the children used Huckleberry Finn to further develop their understanding of character description. In class, we used different words to build sentences to allow the children to understand how to use different sentence starters, adjectives, verbs and nouns within their writing.



In science, we have begun to explore animals including living things. Year 3 and 4 have begun to understand life cycles and the importance of life cycles within their World. We also explored our digestive system and used a banana, scissors as teeth and water as saliva to understand how we digest food. Year 5 and 6 explored the human heart and began to learn the different parts of their heart. The children used this understanding to complete an experiment using a jar, straw and balloon! Why not ask your child about their experiment?
