Dear All

This week in science, Year 3 and 4 have been further exploring the digestive system and the different organs. As a group, we used our understanding to match the organ to a fact! For example your stomach is the size of a tennis ball, but can stretch to the size of a football! We were then able to use this understanding to create a fact file of information related to our digestive system! We even used Bob to explore the organs in our body. Why not ask your child about the digestive system? Year 5 and 6 continued their learning of the human heart. As a group, they were able to examine a graph which showed different heart rates. The children then completed a table with what activity they thought the children were completing. Following on from this, they began their experiment using jelly snakes, why not ask your child what their experiment will show?

In maths, we have begun to explore rounding. As a class, we have been exploring how we can use our understanding of multiples of 10 to round our numbers. We used number lines to help us to understand whether our number was closer to one multiple compared to another. We spent time learning how to effectively round to the nearest 10, following on from this, we will be exploring how to round to the nearest 100 and 1,000. This can be a challenging maths skill for children to learn! Why not practise some rounding at home this weekend? Year 3 has been exploring counting in 50's and using their problem solving and reasoning skills to understand the pattern of numbers when counting this way. Following on from this, they will be exploring number patterns.

In English, we have continued our reading of Coming to England by Floella Benjamin. We have begun reading about Floella's experience of England. As a class, we will use this understanding to write jump off in our entertain block - our setting description based on the London underground. This week, the children have completed their writing of their forest and begun to magpie vocabulary for their own setting description.
