Hazel Years R-2

EYFS – Continuing on from last week, our theme has been all things, Autumn. We have explored a variety of autumnal loose parts and seasonal changes. The children have loved looking at our new seasonal story books on offer in our reading corner. Our fine motor focus has been weaving. In maths, we have been exploring numbers 1,2 and 3 through formation, representations, subitising and ordering.

KS1 - As scientists, we investigated how we can keep our bodies healthy by exploring food groups. We also identified and grouped omnivores, herbivores and carnivores. As historians, we used secondary sources to research what past toys might have looked like and made connections between old and new toys. As mathematicians, the children are really starting to master the concept of addition and subtraction by representing it in several forms for example part-part wholes, bar models and number sentences.

We had a teacher from one of our other Trust schools visit our maths lesson this week. It was wonderful to have her visit as she teaches in a class just like ours with R/1/2. She was amazed by the children's independence and ability to problem solve! We are looking forward to collaborating with her class in the future.
