
Dear Families,



EYFS — Our theme this week has been Fireworks and Diwali! We explored the reasons why we have fireworks and how they make us feel. Our whole EYFS have had lots of fun making Diwali decorations. Our fine motor focus this term is scissor skills. In maths, we have been exploring 1 more and 1 less using representations and numerals. The children loved listening to 5 little speckled frogs! Oak Years 3-6

This week in Oak Class...

As writers the children began their new unit in English, Rose Blanche. The children used drama as a platform to immerse themselves into the story of a young girl living in Germany at the time of World War II and the Nazi regime. As historians, we learnt how the role of women changed during WW2 and how propaganda leaflets urged women to participate in the war effort. As artists, the children studied the work of local artist, Stephen Thomas. They learnt that he prefers to use watercolour to create his paintings inspired by the changing seasons and the effect of weather on the stunning landscapes — many of which the children recognised, including Burgh Island. As athletes, the children enjoyed their first PE session of the term, learning the 5 elements of dance: body, action, space, time and energy. Well done to Milla for being awarded our PE Superstar this week for her immaculate presentation.
