# Hazel Years R-2

EYFS — Our theme this week has been Remembrance Day! We have been using our fine motor skills to do lots of activities and have shared a few picture books to help us explain why we remember. The whole of EYFS have had lots of fun making various poppy art. Our fine motor focus this term is scissor skills. In maths, we have been focussing on circles and triangles. The children were brilliant at finding real life examples and identifying how my sides and points.

**KS1** – As scientists, we have been investigating germs. We have conducted experiments to see how germs spread and how we can reduce the spread. We have ended the week by looking at good and harmful microbes. The children loved creating their own microbes using playdough! As active citizens this week, we have further explored movements and we have started to think about how we can sequence them. The children have also written some beautiful thank you letters to veterans to show them their gratitude.

Home learning consists of reading, spellings, Maths and curriculum themed projects. <u>Reading</u>


