Hazel Years R-2

EYFS — Our theme this week has been Autumn! We have been using our fine motor skills to do lots of activities and have shared a few picture books to help us explain why we remember. The whole of EYFS engaged in an exciting Autumn session making a stick man and exploring seasonal changes. Our fine motor focus this term is scissor skills. In maths, we have been focussing the numbers 4 and 5. We have been exploring how we can represent and write our numerals.

KS1 — As scientists, we have continued to explore germs. We have conducted an experiment to test how hygiene can affect the growth of germs. We have placed bread slices into 5 different bags with unwashed hands, hand sanitised hands, hands washed with soap, with no touching and rubbing on surfaces before placing the bread in. We can't wait to see how quickly the germs will grow over the next week. As artists, we have experimented with using a range of tools on a large scale. It was a fantastic afternoon of learning and we got very messy! As global citizens, we have researched how Muslims, Jews and Christians show that they belong to a faith.
