

# Hazel Years R-2

**EYFS** — In reception this week, our theme has been Planet Earth. The children have been busy exploring our planet and what it looks like. We have explored land, sea, animals and weather. During their EYFS collaboration afternoon, the children shared stories about our Earth and how to look after it. Our fine motor focus this term is pinching. The children have been busy playing Jenga, threading beads and balancing objects. We have seen such fabulous progress in phonics since the Christmas break. A huge shoutout to Emma for writing her first ever sentence this week! We are so proud of you!

**KS1** – As scientists, we continued our learning about everyday materials by exploring properties. We consolidated our learning by going on a material hunt around school! As historians, we have started our new topic of The Royal Family. We

have begun by learning what a monarch is and looking at what a monarch does. We examined Royal objects and how they help the King. As artists, we have also started a new piece of learning based on the work by Andy Goldsworthy. In our lesson this week we shared and discussed his work and our first impressions.
