




Dear Families,

childcare can make this easier. We want you to be aware of government support for your children attending our Nurseries or Wrap around Care Childcare Provision.






West Alvington Academy Weekly Bulletin

Hazel Years R-2

This week in Hazel class...

As scientists, we explored the concept of floating and sinking. The children were amazed that a satsuma floated but peeled it sank. They used their scientific thinking to work out why this might have been.

As global citizens, we looked at where Muslims go to pray. The children explored what it is like inside a mosque and why it is important to the Islamic faith.

As designers, we recapped on our learning about different types of bridges and had their first practice at building a bridge for King Charles III. I was very impressed with their teamwork and ability to problem solve!

As musicians, we first practiced keeping in time to a beat, marching and playing instruments to a simple 1,2,3,4 beat. We also looked at a few key aspects of music such as forte, piano, crescendo and diminuendo. We used the song 'It's oh so quiet' by Bjork.

It is free to access all the books, and there are also loads of different activities you could try at home too! If you misplace their individual login details, please catch either me or Miss Elliott and we can get these for you.




<u>Reception children:</u>

Reading

Reading is key to everything your child will do in school. At West Alvington, we want our children to be confident readers with a love of books. Your support with reading is essential. Children are expected to read at least four times a week with a parent. Please record the name of the book your child has read and the pages they have read.

Home Learning

Year 3 & 4, following your science theory lesson on Thursday, I would like you to investigate the melting point of 3 materials – ice, chocolate and butter. Record your results in the table I have printed for you (use a thermometer if you have one or use a timer). Discuss how accurate your predictions were and whether melting is a reversible change.

Spellings

Each week I will be setting the children spellings for them to learn. These will come from the Tier 2 spelling, or Common Exception Word lists. The children will be tested on these spellings every <u>Friday</u>.
