It is not advice giving or telling you what you're doing wrong... it's about celebrating what it is to be a parent/carer/guardian/grandparent/supporter of our younger people.


It's about seeing through our own feelings of fear, worry and anxiety to be able to see and hear our children from a different space.



It is so lovely to be back together as a class again this week after Year 5 & 6's epic adventures at Heatree Residential. What an incredible bunch of children we have at West Alvington. They showed our values of kindness and friendship together with their new friends from our sister schools and had such an enormous sense of fun and adventure - literally nothing phased them! Abseiling from a 30ft climbing tower, scrambling through tunnels and freezing Dartmoor rivers, raft building and even trekking 13km through blizzards! Miss Elliot and I are so proud of you Year 5 & 6! Year 3 & 4 couldn't wait to watch the slideshow from our trip (230 pictures!) - I know they are feeling inspired and looking forward to their turn next year! As designers, we have been researching the best outer casing for our torches and chose suitable materials which will be hardwearing and long lasting. As mathematicians, we enjoyed learning all about statistics this week. Year 3 & 4 have been using pictograms to represent information while Year 5 & 6 have been getting to grips with line graphs. Reading


Reading is key to everything your child will do in school. At West Alvington, we want our children to be confident readers with a love of books. Your support with reading is essential. Children are expected to read at least four times a week with a parent. Please record the name of the book your child has read and the pages they have read.

Home Learning

This week, I have asked the children to complete a **Reading Identity** to give them an understanding of both who they are as a reader and why they read. This will also act to inform our choices as we continue to add books to our growing library. I have also sent home an optional science activity for fun!

Spellings

Each week 1 will be setting the children spellings for them to learn. We are trialling a new mixed age spelling scheme in Oak Class for which the children each have their own folders. They will be practising these in school until they are confident with the new format.
