

This week in Oak Class...

We were blessed with some sunshine for our trip to West Alvington Woods on Wednesday morning. The children loved learning that the Magna Carta, the American Declaration of Independence and Jane Austin's Pride and Prejudice were all written in Oak Gall Ink! We collected galls and will be having a go at making our own ink with Pete during our next Forest School session. As historians this week, the children learnt about the Ancient Egyptian Pharos and created their own sarcophagus. They learnt that strips of hieroglyphics told the story of who was inside and gave information that might be helpful in the afterlife. It could also warn off grave robbers! As authors, we are writing a balanced argument and researching animals who live in National Parks, asking if tourists should be encouraged to feed them. Our RE lesson this week focused on the important milestones which the children have already achieved, such as when they learnt to walk and talk or the first day they started school. We compared this to how different people mark and celebrate events in life. We identified some beliefs and ideas about commitment along life's journey, e.g. that getting married is a big step, or becoming an adult is a key moment. Some very deep thinking happening in Oak Class this week!
